AND RURAL AFFAIRS****A Grant on the Purchase of Systems for Domestic
Use that Reduce the Use of Energy, or Use Renewable
Sources of Energy**

IN order to further encourage the better use of the energy being generated by the country, the Minister responsible for Resources and Rural Affairs, after consultation with the Minister of Finance, Economy and Investment has made the following scheme which aims to encourage the use of systems for domestic use that reduce the use of energy, or use renewable sources of energy

SCHEME**1. Interpretation**

In this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires:

'applicant' means any person who makes an application for a rebate in terms of this Scheme, is a resident of Malta, is 18 years of age or more on the day of the submittal of the application and who is a holder in terms of article 2 of the Identity Card Act, Cap. 258;

'application' means an application for a grant made in such manner as required and in terms of this scheme;

'Authority' means the Malta Resources Authority established by Article 3 of the Malta Resources Authority Act;

'seller' or 'retailer' means a seller or retailer who is registered with the Authority as a seller or retailer in Malta, of systems eligible for the purposes of and in terms of this scheme;

'effective date' means the 2nd of March, 2009;

'Malta' shall have the same meaning as in article 3 of the Interpretation Act (Cap. 249);

'purchase price of the system' means the final purchase price of the system as shown in the fiscal receipt;

'fiscal receipt' shall have the same meaning as in the Thirteenth Schedule of the Value Added Tax Act (Cap. 406), as subsequently amended, and includes any regulation made by the same Act;

'sistema', 'sistemi', jew 'tagħmir' tfisser *solar water heaters*, panelli fotovoltajiċi, materjal ta' insulazzjoni għas-sħana tal-bjut, jew twieqi jew bibien *double glazed* approvati mill-Awtorità ta' Malta dwar ir-Riżorsi bħala eliġibbli għall-iskema, li jkunu konformi mal-ħtiġiet imsemmija fi Skeda I li tinsab ma din in-Notifika tal-Gvern u li jkunu nixtraw minn Malta fid-data effettiva jew wara, sakemm iddum l-iskema;

'*double glazing*' tfisser tieqa li tikkonsisti f'żewġ saffi ta' ħġieġ separati permezz ta' spazju, mpoġġija biex inaqqsu t-telf tas-sħana u li t-tieqa tkun nixtrat minn Malta;

'materjal ta' insulazzjoni għas-sħana tal-bjut' tfisser tip ta' materjal li jkun introdott b'mod permanenti fil-kostruzzjoni tas-saqaf ta' residenza sabiex itejjeb ir-reżistenza għall-passaġġ tas-sħana ta' dak il-materjal ta' bini u li l-materjal ikun inxtara minn Malta;

'*solar water heater*' tfisser tagħmir għal użu domestiku, li minnu enerġija mix-xemx tiġi utillizzata bħala sors alternattiv ta' enerġija u li t-tagħmir ikun inxtara minn Malta;

'sistema fotovoltajika' tfisser sistema għal użu domestiku li tkun installata f'fond residenzjali, li minnha enerġija tax-xemx tiġi mibdula f'enerġija elettrika, li s-sistema tkun imqabbdha mal-grillja nazzjonali tal-elettriku u li tkun inxtara minn Malta;

'sistema nazzjonali ta' distribuzzjoni ta' elettriku' tfisser is-sistema biex tiġi mqassma enerġija instantanja ta' elettriku f'Malta;

'skema' tfisser l-iskema għal għoti fuq ix-xiri ta' sistemi għal użu domestiku li jnaqqsu l-użu ta' enerġija jew li jużaw sorsi rinovabbli ta' enerġija;

'użu domestiku' tfisser l-użu li jsir minn sistema f'fond residenzjali użat minn applikant għal finijiet residenzjali jew ta' abitazzjoni u ma tinkludix użu minn sidien jew żvilluppanti, jew persuni li jkunu qiegħdin iwettqu xi attività ekonomika fil-post fejn is-sistema tkun ser tiġi installata.

2. Min jista' japplika taħt din l-iskema

Din l-iskema tapplika għall-infiq li jsir mill-applikant fuq ix-xiri ta' sistema għal użu domestiku, li jsir minn bejjieġh bl-imnut reġistrat jew li jkun proviżorjament reġistrat u li l-infiq isir fi żmien erba' xhur minn meta tingħata l-ittra ta' l-offerta. Infiq li ma jintużax għal sistema li ma tkunx għal użu f'fond domestiku li jintuża għal finijiet ta' abitazzjoni mill-applikant mhux eliġibbli għal għotja skond din l-iskema.

3. Infiq li għandu jiġi rapportat

L-infiq li għandu jiġi rapportat huwa dwar il-prezz tax-xiri tas-sistema kif jidher fl-irċevuta fiskali.

'system', 'systems', or 'equipment' means solar water heaters, photovoltaic panels, roof thermal insulation material or double glazed windows or doors approved by the Malta Resources Authority as eligible for the scheme, meeting the requirements listed in Schedule I to this Government Notice, and which are purchased from Malta on or after the effective date, till the duration of the scheme;

'double glazing' means a window consisting of two layers of glass separated by a space, fitted to reduce heat loss and which window is purchased from Malta;

'roof thermal insulation material' means a type of material that is permanently introduced in the roof construction of a residence to improve the resistance to the passage of heat of that building fabric and which material is purchased from Malta;

'solar water heater' means an appliance for domestic use, through which solar energy is utilised as an alternative source of energy and which appliance is purchased from Malta;

'photovoltaic system' means a system for domestic use that is installed at a residential premises, through which system solar energy is converted into electric energy, which system is connected to the national electric grid and which is purchased from Malta;

'national electricity distribution system' means the system for distributing electric power throughout Malta;

'scheme' means the scheme for grant on the purchase of systems for domestic use reducing the use of energy or using renewable sources of energy;

'domestic use' means the use made of a system at a residential premises used by an applicant for residential or habitation purposes and does not include use by landlords or developers, or persons carrying out an economic activity at the place where the system is to be installed.

2. Area of applicability

This scheme applies to the expenditure that is incurred by an applicant on the purchase of a system for domestic use made from a registered retailer or who is provisionally registered and which expenditure is made within four months of the grant offer letter. Expenditure not used for a system not for use at a domestic premises used for habitation purposes by an applicant is not eligible for a grant in terms of this scheme.

3. Expenditure to be reported

The expenditure to be reported is in respect of the purchase price of the system as shown on the fiscal receipt.

4. Kif wiehed japplika u dokumenti li għandhom jiġu provduti

(v) Il-fondi li huma disponibbli għall-iskema huma limitati. Għalhekk in-numru ta' ġhotjiet disponibbli għandhom ikunu limitati kif jidher fi Skeda I. L-applikazzjonijiet għandhom ikunu proċessati skond l-ordni ta' kif ikunu wasslu, sakemm l-allokazzjoni tal-fondi tkun intużat. L-Awtorità tista', fid-diskrezzjoni tagħha, tirċievi wkoll applikazzjonijiet meta l-fondi allokati ma' l-iskema jkunu ġew użati. Dik l-irċevuta m'għandhiex tkun kostruwita biex timplika xi forma ta' responsabbiltà, jew xi forma ta' obligazzjoni fuq l-Awtorità jew fuq il-Gvern biex iħallsu xi ammont ta' flus. 5. Ġhotja li tiffallas taħt din l-iskema

(i) L-applikanti jistgħu japplikaw għal ġhotja fuq is-sistema fil-formola stabbilita fi Skeda I u kif indikat fil-linjigwida u noti gwida stabbiliti fi Skeda II. L-applikanti li jkunu rċeview għotja għal sistema jew għal sistemi simili fl-2008 m'għandhomx ikunu eliġibbli għal ġhotja oħra. L-applikanti m'għandhomx ikunu eliġibbli għal aktar minn għotja waħda għal kull teknoloġija;

(ii) Waħda mill-kundizzjonijiet tal-ġhotja hi li s-sistema għandha tibqa' installata u fi-użu, u m'għandhiex tiġi mibdula b'dak il-mod li jista' jiddegrada il-ħidma tagħha għal perjodu minimu ta' hames snin wara l-installazzjoni tagħha. Hija r-responsabbiltà tal-applikant li jiżgura li din il-kundizzjoni tiġi milħuqa. L-applikanti li jonqsu milli jonoraw din il-kundizzjoni għandhom iħallsu lura l-ammont ta' l-ġhotja kif

4. Manner of application and supporting documents

(i) Applications under this scheme shall be made by the applicant prior to purchase, in the form set out in Schedule III to this scheme and shall contain all the information, details and documents as mentioned in such form, as required in terms of this scheme and as listed in the guidelines and guidance notes set out in Schedule II;

(ii) Applications shall be accompanied by the documents listed in the application form, and any other document which the Minister responsible for Resources and Rural Affairs, upon consultation with the Minister of Finance, Economy and Investment may, from time to time, require;

(iii) Only those applications that are found to conform with all the requirements of this scheme shall be eligible for the payment of the grant referred to in clause 5 of the Scheme. The system should be eligible prior to application, and the retailer registered prior to application. Applications that do not meet these criteria at the time of application shall be rejected;

iv. No system shall be installed before the issue of a letter of grant by the Authority;

v. The funds available for the scheme are limited. Therefore, the number of grants available are to be limited as shown in Schedule I. Applications shall be processed on a first come first served basis until the allocation of funds is exhausted. The Authority may, at its discretion, also receive applications when the funds allocated to the scheme have been exhausted. Such receipt shall not be construed to imply any form of liability, or any form of obligation on the Authority or the Government to pay any amount of money. Applications that are submitted prior to the effective date shall be rejected.

5. Grant payable under this scheme

(i) Applicants may apply for a grant on the system in the form set out in Schedule I and as indicated in the guidelines and guidance notes set out in Schedule II. Applicants who have received a grant for a system or for similar systems in 2008 shall not be eligible for another grant. Applicants shall not be eligible to more than one grant per technology;

(ii) One of the conditions of the grant is that the system shall remain installed and in use, and shall not be modified in such a way as to degrade its performance for a minimum period of five years after its installation. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that this condition is met. Applicants that fail to honour this condition shall refund the amount of the grant plus interest accrued as from the day of its granting

i. L-applikazzjoniet għar-reġistrazzjoni tal-bejgiegħa jew bejgiegħa bl-imnut għall-finijiet ta' din l-iskema għandhom isiru fuq il-formola stabbilita fi Skeda IV li tinsab ma' din in-Notifika tal-Gvern u għandu jkun fihom l-informazzjoni, d-dettalji u d-dokumenti kollha kif meħtieġa f'dik il-formola u skond din l-iskema;

ii. Il-bejgiegħa jew bejgiegħa bl-imnut jistgħu jkunu reġistrati proviżorjament mill-Awtorità. Spezzjonijiet ta' sistemi installati għandhom jiġu mwettqa mill-Awtorità jew l-aġenti tagħha, u bejgiegħa jew bejgiegħa bl-imnut li jkunu bieghu installazzjonijiet li ma jkunux installati skond prattika tajba għandu jkollhom ir-reġistrazzjoni tagħhom irtirata. 8. Reġistrazzjoni ta' sistemi

i. Applikazzjonijiet għal reġistrazzjoni ta' sistemi għall-ghanijiet ta' din l-iskema għandhom isiru mill-bejgiegħ jew mill-bejgiegħ bl-imnut fil-formola stabbilita fi Skeda V li tinsab ma' din in-Notifika tal-Gvern u għandu jkun fihom l-informazzjoni, d-dettalji u d-dokumenti kollha kif meħtieġ f'dik il-formola u skond din l-iskema;

ii. Bejgiegħa jew bejgiegħa bl-imnut għandhom jiżguraw

to the MRA. Should the property be sold and the system retained by the new owner, the contract of sale shall specify the transfer of obligations from the applicant to the new owner of the premises.

6. Payment of Grant

The grant shall be paid to the applicant by cheque posted to the address shown on the application, or by bank transfer to a bank account indicated by the applicant in his application.

7. Registration of sellers or retailers

i. Applications for the registration of sellers or retailers for the purposes of this Scheme shall be made in the form set out in Schedule IV to this Government Notice and shall contain all the information, details and documents as required in such form and in terms of this scheme;

ii. Sellers or retailers may be provisionally registered by the Authority. Inspections of systems installed shall be carried out by the Authority or its agents, and sellers or retailers found to have sold installations that are not installed according to good practice shall have their registration withdrawn. It is the responsibility of the seller or retailer to ensure that a system is installed according to good practice. The Authority shall establish its own criteria for deciding whether a system is installed according to good practice;

iii. Sellers or retailers shall provide a minimum period of guarantee of five years in regard to the systems sold. The minimum requirements for the guarantee shall be as established by the Authority;

iv. Applications submitted to the Authority for registration as a seller or retailer shall be accompanied by the documents listed in the application form, and any other document which the Minister responsible for Resources and Rural Affairs, after consultation with the Minister of Finance, Economy and Investment may, from time to time, require.

8. Registration of systems

i. Applications for the registration of systems for the purposes of this Scheme shall be made by the seller or retailer in the form set out in Schedule V to this Government Notice and shall contain all the information, details and documents as required in such form and in terms of this scheme;

ii. Sellers or retailers shall ensure that their registration

12. Dispożizzjonijiet transitorji

Applikanti li jkunu xtraw jew installaw sistema qabel il-15 ta' Frar, 2009 għandhom ikunu eliġibbli li japplikaw taħt il-kundizzjonijiet tal-iskemi stabbiliti min-Notifika tal-Gvern 135 ta' l-2006 għal PV's u insulazzjoni tal-bjut, u min-Notifika tal-Gvern 55 ta' l-2006 fil-każ ta' *solar water heaters*, sal-15 ta' Mejju, 2009, jiġifieri sa tliet xhur mid-data li fiha tagħlaq l-iskema preċedenti. iii. Registrations of products or equipment made by sellers or retailers may be withdrawn at any time by the Authority, after giving due notice, and reasons, to the seller or retailer.

9. Validity of application

An application shall not be deemed to have been submitted unless it is full and complete in all material particulars and unless it contains all the information and is accompanied by all the documentation requested therein.

10. Duration of the Scheme

Applications for this scheme shall be received as from the 16 February, 2009 until 28th February, 2009 with regard to PV's. As regards other systems mentioned under this scheme, applications shall be received as from the 16th of February, 2009 and the scheme shall remain operative for a period of one year, unless the scheme is modified or terminated beforehand by means of a Notice in the Gazette, and it may be renewed as deemed necessary by the Minister responsible for Resources and Rural Affairs upon consultation with the Minister of Finance, Economy and Investment by means of a notice in the Gazette.

11. Amendments to the Scheme.

The Minister responsible for Resources and Rural Affairs upon consultation with the Minister of Finance, Economy and Investment, shall have the right to make any necessary amendments to this scheme by the publication of a notice containing such amendments in the Gazette.

12. Transitory provisions

Applicants who have purchased or installed a system before the 15th February, 2009 shall be eligible to apply under the terms of the schemes established by Government Notice 135 of 2006 for PVs and roof insulation, and by Government Notice 55 of 2006 in the case of solar water heaters, up to the 15th May, 2009, that is within three months of the closing date of the previous scheme. Applicants who have purchased or installed a double glazing system before the 15th February, 2009, shall not be eligible for a rebate.

Promotion of Energy efficiency and use of renewable Sources of Energy In the domestic Sector - Guidelines

In order to further encourage the better use of the energy being generated by the country, the Government of Malta through the Malta Resources Authority has launched the following Aid Scheme that aims to encourage the use of renewable sources of energy for domestic use.

AID SCHEME

Introduction

These guidance notes are intended to assist applicants how to benefit for the various schemes, by providing information on the filling of the application forms and on the various eligibility criteria and other conditions. The application for an investment aid is made by the applicant and therefore any contractual arrangements relative to this scheme are between the applicant and the Malta Resources Authority.

The legal basis on which investment aids will be offered and paid is set out in the Government Notice. If there is any conflict and ambiguity between the guidance set out in this document and the Government Notice, the Government Notice supersedes these guidance notes.

Overview of the scheme

The application form is divided in three parts. Applicants must complete part I of the applications themselves. Part II must be filled in by the retailer and Part III by both the retailer and the applicant. Part I and Part II must be completed and sent to the Malta Resources Authority prior to the purchase and installation of equipment and Part III has to be completed and returned once the equipment is installed.

Retailers may provisionally register themselves as retailers and register their products between the 26 January 2009 and 13 February 2009. To obtain registration, retailers (and products) will have to show that they are qualified and eligible for the scheme. Retailers will need to produce all required documentation including certified true copies of laboratory reports confirming that the systems registered meet the appropriate standards. Provisionally registered retailers will be subject to inspections to verify that their installers are competent to carry out installations.

The list of provisionally registered retailers, approved models and prices will be published on the MRA website.

Applications for this scheme shall be received as from the 16 February, 2009 until 28th February, 2009 with regard to PV's. As regards other systems mentioned under this scheme, applications shall be received as from the 16th of February, 2009 and the scheme shall remain operative for a period of one year, unless the scheme is modified or terminated beforehand by means of a Notice in the Gazette, and it may be renewed as deemed necessary by the Minister responsible for Resources and Rural Affairs upon consultation with the Minister of Finance, Economy and Investment by means of a notice in the Gazette.

Applications should be made PRIOR to installation or ordering of equipment (except as detailed below). One application will be accepted per applicant. Applications prior to the opening date will not be accepted.

Applicants who have installed equipment before 15 February 2009 will be eligible to apply under the terms of the 2006 scheme (Government Notice 135 of 2006 for PVs and roof thermal insulation and government notice 55 of 2006 and 203 of 2005 for solar water heaters) up to the 15 May 2009. No applications under the 2006 schemes will be accepted after the 15 May 2009.

Prior registration of retailers and registration of models will be required. Retailers must register prices which may be checked by the Consumer and Competition Division. No applications which exceed the registered price will be accepted.

Retailers will be subject to have a number of installations certified prior to their being eligible to participate in the scheme. New retailers will be provisionally accepted, their installations will be inspected and application accepted according to quality of their installations. After five installations have been inspected and found to be of good quality, retailers will be certified.

Householder applications will be processed, and budgeted funds allocated, in accordance with the arrangements published by Malta Resources Authority. Once budgeted funds are allocated, there is no guarantee that pending applications will be successful, even if all eligibility criteria are met.

Steps in Applying for the Aid Scheme

Step 1

Read the programme guidelines and information about the renewable energy/energy efficiency investment aid scheme.

Step 2

Contact designers and suppliers of systems to help assess electricity demands, conduct a review of energy use and determine the appropriate type and size of system required. It is recommended that the applicant contact more than one potential supplier.

Step 3

Ensure that you have obtained planning permission for your installation if necessary

Step 4

Get a quotation but do not order or install the equipment/materials. Fill in Part I and Part II of the aid scheme application form prior to purchase.

Step 5

Submit the application to the Malta Resources Authority together with the required attachments. Applicant will be allowed in MRA premises in small groups with one application per person, starting on the 16 February 2009 until the 28 February 2009. Part I and Part II of the application must be approved by the Malta Resources Authority before equipment is purchased and installed.

Step 6

You will receive a grant Offer Letter if the scheme criteria are met and the application is successful; you may order and install the system. Successful applications may be published on the website.

Step 7

After the installation is complete, fill in the MRA notification form (for pv panels only) and return it to MRA.

Step 7

When the installation of a renewable generation/energy efficiency system has been completed, Part III of the aid scheme application form including all required attachments must be submitted to the Malta Resources Authority. Aid scheme completion forms must reach the Malta Resources Authority within the date indicated on the Grant offer letter. You can notify the Authority and apply for the investment aid on the same occasion. Acknowledgement notes will be issued to applicants stating that documents have been received but still have to be approved.

Step 8

The Malta Resources Authority will assess the aid scheme application and the details of the installed system against information provided in the original Pre-purchase application (part I and part II of the application).

Step 9

Payments of aid schemes will usually be processed within six weeks of receipt of a fully and correctly completed aid scheme application including all required attachments. The investment aid will be paid to the applicant through a cheque or bank transfer.

Note: The Malta Resources Authority requires full details (entered into the relevant forms or attached as required) to assess applications and reserves the right to suspend processing of incomplete applications until all necessary details have been provided. The Malta Resources Authority will advise any applicant so affected of the necessary details required to complete an application.

Your application will be assessed to make sure all the information and documents supplied meet the grant requirements. If there is a problem you will receive a letter explaining what the problem is.

Once your application meets all the criteria and is approved, your application will be processed for payment. MRA appointed auditors may inspect any system for which aid has been given. If the equipment is not according to the information claimed in the application, the investment aid will not be processed or the sum paid will have to be returned to Malta Resources Authority with interests.

An investment aid will only be paid once the installation has been completed. The application form must be sent in with the documentation listed in the application form.

Details of the schemes

1. Interpretation

In this Scheme, unless the context otherwise requires:

'applicant' means any person, who is a resident of Malta and is 18 years of age or over on the day of application and has made an application for a grant in terms of this Scheme;

'Authority' and 'MRA' mean the Malta Resources Authority;

'date of purchase' means the date on the last fiscal receipt relating to the purchase; provided that this date is not later than one year after the date of order;

'duration of the scheme' means the period between, and including, the effective date and the termination date.

'effective date' means the 16 February 2009;

'fiscal receipt' means a receipt as defined in the Thirteenth Schedule of Chapter 406 - the Value Added Tax Act, Act XX111 of 1998 as subsequently amended - and also includes any regulation made by the same Act;

'Malta' means the Maltese Islands;

'Micro-generation' means the production of heat or electricity on a small scale from a low carbon source

'you' or 'your' refers to the individual named as the applicant in the application

'technology' or 'technologies' refers to the micro-generation technology type or energy efficiency equipment to be installed at the property and has the same meaning as system in the Government Gazette.

'owner' includes 'joint ownership', 'emphyteuta' includes 'joint-emphyteuta' and 'tenant' includes 'joint-tenant', and 'emphytueta' includes 'sub-emphyteuta' and 'tenant' includes 'sub-tenant';

'RES system' means new solar photovoltaic systems and solar thermal hot water systems;

'termination date' shall mean termination date as established by Government notice and not later than 31 December 2009;

'date of order' means the date on the invoice or of the first fiscal receipt, whichever is earlier

2. Area of applicability

This Scheme applies to the expenditure that is incurred on the purchase of an eligible technology purchased for use in domestic premises and installed in Malta, and for which an application has been made for the duration of the Aid Scheme. Aid is not payable in respect of technologies installed in caravans, boats or boathouses or in similar setups.

3. Eligible Applicant

To be eligible an applicant must:

- have obtained planning permission (where required) for the installation. The building should also be covered by a planning permit.
- be the owner of the property or an emphyteuta or a tenant with all the necessary authority to apply for the grant.
- Be a resident of Malta and have an ID card as per the Identity Card Act.
- not obtain any other grants or subsidies for this system from any other schemes that include Government of Malta funds or EU funds. Any investment aid for that particular system must be solely that given by the scheme managed by the Malta Resources Authority. Applicants may qualify for not more than one rebate per technology (this includes rebates since 1 January 2008 – ie a customer who was granted a rebate for a solar water heater during 2008 is not eligible for another rebate for a solar water heater under the new scheme).
- Have purchased the equipment or system from Malta
- install the equipment in a property which is for domestic use and is not used by him to carry out an economic activity or as an undertaking.
- not be applying on behalf of an undertaking and not be a landlord of the property where the system is installed.
- Provide the MRA with a bank account to enable transfer of the investment aid directly to his account
- Allow MRA Auditors to perform on site inspection of the equipment installed
- Accept that data on the application form, including his name together with the eligible investment aid may appear on public documents including the MRA website, in whole or in part, and in stages of processing the application.

The Authority reserves the right to refuse the grant and take legal action to recover the amount granted with interests and any other costs incurred, in case of:

- incorrect information being stated by the applicant in this application
- some conditions of the scheme not being met or,
- the grant having been already given;
- other reasons where the 'bona fide' intention of the applicant is manifestly missing.

4. Eligible expenditure

The expenditure to be reported is in respect of the purchase price of the system as shown on the fiscal receipt. Local Payments would have to be effected by bank transfer or else by cheque. The respective proof of payment would be the fiscal receipt issued according to law. Only purchases from a registered retailer will be accepted for the rebate scheme. Overseas purchases will not be eligible for a rebate. Payments that are not accompanied with a fiscal receipt issued in Malta according to Maltese law are not eligible.

The eligible costs are:

- For PV and wind systems: Cost of photovoltaic generation equipment or wind turbine generation equipment and inverter, including VAT but excluding (i) the cost of any extended warranty beyond the standard warranty that installers are required to provide free of charge; (ii) the cost of any other materials, works or other costs such as, but not limited to, any cost of general wiring at property; and (iii) costs of permits or certification.
- For solar hot water systems: Costs of solar hot water panels, plus their fixing to the roof or ground, including VAT, but excluding (i) the cost of any extended warranty beyond the standard warranty that installers are required to provide free of charge; (ii) the cost of any other materials, works or other costs such as, but not limited to, any cost of plumbing at property; and (iii) costs of permits or certification.
- For roof insulation: Cost of roof insulation material, plus its fixing on the roof, including VAT, but excluding (i) the cost of any extended warranty beyond the standard warranty that installers are required to provide free of charge; (ii) the cost of any other materials, works or other costs such as but not limited to, any laying of roof compounds and (iii) costs of permits or certification.

The following materials shall be excluded for the purpose of this grant:-

- (i) normal cement/sand screed (*kontrabejt*),
- (ii) stone chippings used for *torba*,
- (iii) structural membranes in concrete steel (such as corrugated steel sheeting unless the latter is factorybonded to the roof insulation), natural stone and wood,
- (iv) bituminous or rubberised roofing membranes and compounds including paints for UV protection,
- (v) agricultural shading nets,
- (vi) tiles of cement, ceramic or natural stone material,
- (vii) any shading devices.

- For double glazing: Cost of double glazing plus its fixing to the window frame, including VAT, but excluding (i) the cost of any extended warranty beyond the standard warranty that installers are required to provide free of charge; (ii) the cost of any other materials, works or other costs such as, but not limited to, any costs of plastering or decorating at the site, and general fixtures at property; and (iii) costs of permits or certification.

5. Manner of application and supporting documents

- (i) Applications under this Scheme shall be made by the applicant in the form, set out in the Schedule to this Scheme and shall contain all the information, details and documents as required in the said form and in terms of this Scheme.
- (ii) Retailers are required to register their equipment prior to making it available for sale.
- (iii) Applications shall be accompanied by the documents listed in the application form.
- (iv) Only those applications that are found to conform to all the provisions of this Scheme shall be eligible for payment of the grant.
- (v) Applications under this Scheme, including the documents that are to be submitted with the application, shall be submitted/sent by the applicant to the Malta Resources Authority, Millennia, second floor Aldo Moro Street Marsa by not later than the date stipulated on the grant offer letter.

6. Grant offer Letter

Your application will be assessed to make sure all the information supplied meets the grant requirements.

Once your application meets all the criteria and is approved, we will send you a Grant Offer Letter and a reference number. This will confirm the grant amount that has been allocated for you. We will aim to do this within two weeks of receipt of your application depending on the number of applications we receive.

6. Grant Claim Deadline

Grant offers are valid for a limited time period. MRA will inform you of the limited time period in the grant offer letter to be issued after the pre approval application. The relevant deadlines for each technology are as follows:

Technology/Installation Type	Grant Claim Deadline
Solar Photovoltaic	Four months from the date of grant offer letter.
Solar thermal hot water	Four months from the date of grant offer letter.
Roof insulation	Four months from the date of grant offer letter.
Double glazing	Four months from the date of grant offer letter.

Please confirm with your qualified installer an installation date for your technology. If your installation has not been completed within the given timeframe your grant will expire and a claim cannot be made. If you are not intending to install a system within the timescales outlined above, do not submit a grant application.

7. Grant payable under this Scheme

The applicable grant is as follows, per applicant per installation:

Photovoltaic systems:

50% of eligible costs up to a maximum of €3,000 ;

Solar water heaters: 66% of eligible costs up to a maximum of €460 .

Roof insulation: 33% of eligible costs up to a maximum of €300

Double glazing: 33% of eligible costs up to a maximum of €300 .

8. Payment of Grant

You will receive receipt payment by cheques or bank transfer

9. Validity of application

An application shall not be deemed to have been submitted unless it is full and complete in all material respects and unless it contains all the information and is accompanied by all the documentation requested therein.

10. Duration of the Scheme

This Scheme shall remain in force until the termination date and subject to availability of funds unless modified/terminated beforehand by a Notice in the Gazette, and shall be renewed as deemed necessary. Applications relating to purchases on or before the termination date shall continue to be accepted, if the scheme is not terminated earlier, for a period of three months termination date.

11. Amendments to the Scheme

Government shall have the right to make any amendments to this Scheme by the publication of the said amendments in the Gazette.

12. Guarantee and Period of operation

The Authority is required to ensure that the funds it administers provide a certain amount of environmental benefits. For this reason, one of the conditions of the grant is that the system will remain installed and in use, and will not be modified in such a way as to degrade its performance for a period of at least five years after installation. It is a responsibility of the applicant to ensure that this condition is met. Applicants that fail to honour this condition will have to refund investment aid plus interests to the Authority. The retailer shall include a full system guarantee for five years, with a penalty clause in case of default. For PV's the guarantee should cover output (in kWh) for a period of five years (note that each PV is individually metered by Enemalta). In the case of default, a penalty will be specified. In the case of default, a penalty of 16*20c*difference between guaranteed output and actual output. The Malta Resources Authority may perform on site inspections throughout the five years to ensure that the equipment is still in operation and may require information from the retailer or the applicant to demonstrate that the system output is according to the output guarantee. Applicants are requested to submit a performance testing certificate signed by a qualified engineer. This is being done to ensure that equipment is installed and functional.

13. Compliance with standards

- (a) The systems shall be certified as compliant with international standards as specified below. Certified true copies of laboratory reports will be required.
 - PV systems shall be certified to MSA EN61215 or MSA EN61646 or equivalent
 - Solar hot water systems shall be certified to MSA EN12975-1 or MSA EN12976-1 or the solar keymark certification or an equivalent certification .
 - Roof Insulation shall be certified to the regulations: Technical guidance Conservation of fuel, energy & natural resources (minimum requirements on energy performance of building regulations, 2006)

- Double glazing shall meet the requirements of: Technical guidance Conservation of fuel, energy & natural resources (minimum requirements on energy performance of building regulations, 2006)

Evidence of compliance is generally accepted as independent third party testing by Malta Standards Authority (MSA) accredited test laboratory. However, other evidence of compliance may be considered at the discretion of the Malta Resources Authority.¹

Where testing is to be or has been conducted by an independent, third party, test laboratory, which is accredited for the applicable testing by MSA or equivalent, then the following shall apply:

The results of the testing shall be recorded in test report(s) that shall:

- Be in English (or be accompanied by an authorised translation);
- Be in full, be correctly signed/authorised by the test laboratory and verify that all applicable requirements are met;
- Identify the make, model number and build status of the product tested, and give details of any modifications and/or testing made to meet the requirements;
- Be less than 4 years old (reports over 4 years old may be acceptable if there is sufficient evidence of their continued validity, (e.g. periodic surveillance of the production processes, audit testing etc.).

Additionally manufacturers shall provide a written declaration stating that the product tested was a production sample and is fully representative of the current production or identifying any modifications to the design, production processes or materials.

Where one or more of the required characteristics are the same for products with similar design, construction and functionality (i.e product families), then the results of tests of these characteristics on one product may be applied to other similar products, subject to an assessment of the validity of this approach.

- Proof of compliance to these standards must be made through the presentation of true certified copies of lab reports for PVs and Solar water heaters.
- For roof insulation the retailer must present a certificate from the manufacturer demonstrating the K (thermal conductivity) value. The final U value of the installed roof insulation should not exceed 0.59 for the complete roof. An architect's certificate must be presented to confirm the final U- value of the roof insulation.
- For double glazing, the retailer must present a certificate from the manufacturer demonstrating the K (thermal conductivity) value. For double glazing the final U value must be equivalent or better than table F1 or F2 in the regulations Technical guidance Conservation of fuel, energy & natural resources (minimum requirements on energy performance of building regulations, 2006). The installer will need to certify the gap of the double glazed windows. New buildings that have been certified to conform to the building regulations by an architect may present this certification for verification of U-value and gap of double glazed windows.

(b) PV systems and solar water heaters shall be issued with a commissioning test certificate. True certified copies shall be supplied to the Authority. This certificate is separate from the electrical installation test certificate or from the CE mark.

Guidance on the format of the test certification shall be published on the MRA website.

14. Guarantees of origin and feed-in fees

The owner or operator of a system on which a grant has been paid shall not be automatically eligible to the ownership of any guarantees of origin for the green energy produced, or to any changes to the tariff structures for the purchase (by the distribution system operator (Enemalta)) of electricity produced by the system.

¹Accreditation bodies which are members of the European co-operation for Accreditation (EA) or International Accreditation Forum (IAF) Multilateral Recognition Agreement (MLA) are considered as equivalent to MSA

15. Audit

The Authority has to be able to verify, if need be, that any grants paid by it were properly payable and were applied in the proper way. For this reason, you must ensure that you comply with the record keeping and inspection requirements set out in the following paragraphs.

(a) You must keep a record of all relevant documentation that you obtain in relation to the technology and its installation, including in particular the original of any quotations and invoices from the relevant qualified installer or any other contractors involved in the installation work. You must keep these records for at least 5 years following payment of the grant and if MRA asks you to do so at any time (and as long as it gives you reasonable prior notice) you must allow authorised representatives of MRA and/or its agents and/or any national audit body to inspect and take copies of these records.

(b) If MRA asks you to do so at any time (and as long as it gives you reasonable prior notice) you must permit MRA and its authorised inspectors or other representatives to have access to the property for the purposes of inspecting the technology and/or verifying whether the energy efficiency measures required by these terms and conditions have been put in place.

(c) If the MRA asks you to do so at any time, you must provide such additional information and co-operation as MRA may request for the purposes of MRA monitoring energy use of the property and/or the performance of the technology. The MRA will be entitled to use this information, amongst other things, for the purposes of publishing reports in relation to the relevant technology.

16. Publicity

If at any time you use the technology in any advertising or otherwise publish any information about the technology, you must make clear as part of the relevant activity that you have received a grant using national funds. However, you must not do or say anything that may lead a third party to believe that you are acting as an agent of the Authority.

The names of applicants and the corresponding aid given may appear in public official documents.

17. Data Protection

Acceptance of funding is an automatic acceptance of the individual's inclusion in the publication (electronic or otherwise) of the list of applicants, the names of the operations and the amount of public funding allocated to the operation.

18. Compliance with legislation

You must ensure that in carrying out any activities in connection with the installation and use of the technology you and anyone acting on your behalf complies with all applicable laws and regulations. This grant is subject to Maltese legislation. The grant is also made to the applicant personally and may not be transferred. The grant does not confer any rights. The MRA will not lose any right that it has under these terms and conditions if it does not exercise that right or delays in exercising it.

19. Liability

The MRA cannot and does not guarantee or underwrite the performance of any technology and you should ensure that the retailer and installer you contract with provides you with all necessary information in relation to the warranty cover they will be providing and the insurance cover it has in place.

20. Type of Technology

The technology to be installed at the property must be applicable to the requirements of the call of the aid scheme. Technical details of the system and model number are required to ensure that the equipment being purchased is in fact applicable to the scheme. The documents bearing the technical details of the equipment must be certified true copies of certified lab reports.

As at the date on which these terms and conditions were issued, aids schemes are only available in relation to particular types of micro-generation technology and energy efficiency, as follows:-

- Solar photovoltaic, with an installed capacity of more than 0.5kW
- Solar thermal hot water
- Roof insulation
- Double glazing

In addition, the specific technology (i.e. the specific type of micro-generation product) to be installed at the property must have specific approval by the MRA.

The installed system must be compliant with applicable regulation and technical codes such as the national network code.

21. The Application form explained

Section A: Applicant details: This section requires factual information about you as the applicant. We will consider that you are willing to communicate by email if you provide us with your email address.

Section B: Address where system is to be installed: This section requires detailed information on the installation address. In case there are ambiguities about the address, applicants are advised to provide a site map with a clear indication of the installation address. This is required to ensure that technology is installed in a local residence and to permit Malta Resources Authority auditors to perform site inspections.

Section C: Mailing Address: This needs to be filled in if you would like correspondence to be mailed to a different address from the installation address given in section B.
